### 2016 BATTLEWIN PREMIER LEAGUE ROUND 13 (2/3 JULY)

#### SUMMARY

- Killarney District has maintained its six-point lead following Round 13 of the Battlewin Premier League competition and remains unbeaten in all three grades, a total of 34 matches without defeat. Gosford City has moved into third place with a game in hand over the two teams above them. For the second straight round all four bottom teams were beaten leaving a six-point gap between sixth and seventh place.
- After three matches in a week it's a similar situation in Division One with East Gosford recording their 14th straight win and closing in on a guaranteed return to Premier League next season. The Sea-FM Womens League looks like being a three-way battle between The Entrance, Gosford City and Killarney District.

#### **THE ENTRANCE vs BERKELEY VALE**

- The Entrance have extended their winning run to four matches with a 2-0 victory over Berkeley Vale on Saturday night at Mingara Club Oval. Both goals came in the first quarter of the match with Tyson Adams following his brace against Toukley by scoring from a well-placed free-kick in the 10th minute. Zac Anastas then doubled the margin in the 24th minute with his sixth goal of the season.
- The win kept the defending premiers in sixth place but closed the margin between them and fourth-placed Terrigal to four points. With six losses and just one win from their last seven matches Berkeley Vale remain in seventh place and look set for a four-way tussle with Avoca, Wyoming and Umina to avoid relegation.

#### **WYOMING vs KILLARNEY DISTRICT**

- Killarney District have come from beaten with two late goals to defeat a tenacious Wyoming team 2-1 at Alan Davidson Park. After the second-worst Premier League defeat in the club's history in the first round the Tigers were determined to avoid a repeat of that 9-1 loss. They shocked the premiership favourites by taking the lead through Sam Dooley in the 35th minute and holding it until well into the second half before Killarney's constant pressure eventually broke through Wyoming's defence in the 70th minute with John Whelpdale equalizing. A series of brilliant saves by goalkeeper Ben Xerri kept Wyoming in the match before Matt Hall scored the winner for the Terriers with 10 minutes to play.

- Killarney will now travel south to meet Southern-Ettalong at James Browne Oval in next Sunday deferred round while Wyoming will meet Umina at Plum Park in the first of a string of matches which will likely determine whether they can avoid relegation for the first time since 2000.

### **GOSFORD CITY vs TERRIGAL**

- Returning to the scene of their shock 5-2 loss to Terrigal in the first round Gosford City have continued their push up the ladder with a 4-2 win at Plum Park. After a slow start to the season the Dragons are gaining momentum with their third straight win. A deflected strike from coach Ian McAndrew gave Gosford the lead in the 39th minute although it was quickly cancelled out by Fergus Worrall's sixth goal of the season. Gosford struck early in the second half through Adam Woodbine followed by a 56th minute penalty to Matt Hall. Terrigal were reduced to ten men three minutes later when Jack Ragen received a second yellow card. Matt Hall's eventful second half continued with a missed penalty shot in the 66th minute followed by a goal from open play in the 82nd to give Gosford an unassailable 4-1 lead. Prior to that the Dragons also had a player sent off, with Jared McNee also receiving a second yellow. Alex Arbello finished the scoring with a consolation goal for Terrigal in the last minute.
- Gosford City will be back at Plum Park next Saturday Night for their deferred Round 10 match against The Entrance. The two teams will play for a new trophy called the Coast Shelter Cup and will be a major part of the Gosford club's commitment to that local charity for the homeless. Funds will be raised on the night through raffles, bucket collections and a \$50 per head function in the CCF clubhouse. The Dragons will play in a special all-blue strip that matches the Coast Shelter charity's colours.
- With Duffys Oval closed next weekend Terrigal will also return to Plum Park for their crucial match against Toukley on Sunday afternoon.

### **SOUTHERN-ETTALONG vs AVOCA**

- Southern & Ettalong United have consolidated their place in the top half of the competition with a 3-1 win over Avoca at James Browne Oval. Just like the early rounds of the European Championships most of the action took place in the last five minutes of the match with three of four goals scored in that period. After a scoreless first half SEU took the lead five minutes in the second term through James Caban. The same player started the late flurry with his second in the 85th minute followed in quick succession by a goal to Avoca's captain/coach Shane Knight before Tom Leslie's first Premier League top grade goal to Tom Leslie.
- Southern will be at home again next Sunday faced with the daunting task of slowing or stopping the Killarney juggernaut while Avoca will play Berkeley Vale at Mingara in a match which could play an important part in the battle of both sides to avoid relegation.

### **TOUKLEY vs UMINA**

- Toukley have bounced back strongly from the previous week's loss to The Entrance with a comfortable 3-1 win over Umina at their Harry Moore Oval fortress. Three of the four goals came in the crucial five-minute periods on either side of half-time with Toukley looking to have the game under control leading 3-0 at the break. All three of the Gunners goals came from Jai Kelly (the second from the penalty spot) who has thrown out a challenge for the 2016 Battlewin Golden Boot award. Kelly's second hat-trick of the season takes him to 11 goals, three behind tearaway leader, Killarney's Tim Knight. Todd Beckman scored Umina's goal two minutes into the second half.

- Toukley now meet Terrigal in the battle of the promoted clubs at Pluim Park next Sunday. Umina will also be at CCF headquarters, on Saturday night, for a vital match against Wyoming with both of the previous high-flying clubs under serious relegation threat.
