SUMMARY

- Once again there were goals galore as the Battlewin Mens Premier League moved into its second round with a further 24 scored on top of the record 30 in Round One. Newly-promoted Toukley-Gorokan hold on to top spot on goal difference ahead of Gosford City and Killarney District with all three clubs recording their second straight wins while Southern-Ettalong and Terrigal are the only clubs without points.
- Three clubs have advanced to the fifth round of the national FFA Cup competition following mid-week matches with The Entrance easy 6-1 winners over Maroubra United at Pat Morley Oval; Berkeley Vale beating Glenmore Park 1-0 at Mingara; and Killarney District overcoming Gosford City 4-3 in an entertaining encounter at Pluim Park. Umina United put in an outstanding effort against NPL2 club Bankstown Berries beaten 2-0 with goals in the last two minutes. The other surviving Coast club, Southern-Ettalong went down 8-4 to Dulwich Hill.
- Fifth round FFA Cup matches will be played on either 20th or 21st April with The Entrance at home to NPL3 club Hawkesbury City; Berkeley Vale away to State League opponents St George FA; and Killarney District having the toughest task against NPL2 club Mount Druitt.

SOUTHERN-ETTALONG vs GOSFORD CITY

- For the second straight round Southern-Ettalong have been beaten by the odd goal, going down 3-2 to Gosford City in their match at the newly-drained and re-surfaced James Browne Oval. Both teams went into the match after mid-week FFA Cup matches with Gosford the most affected not only by having played 24 hours later than SEU but also without two key players, Matt Hall and Reece Caira, through suspensions. Despite these setbacks the Dragons took the lead midway through the first half through player/coach Ian McAndrew. SEU hit back quickly through 2015 Golden Boot winner Keith Gumbs. Benji Gosson restored the visitor's lead before the break. City looked to have the game in their control when last season's CCFC First Grade skipper Adam Woodbine extending the lead to 3-1 in the 65th minute however Southern fought back tenaciously with Chris Myles scoring and were unlucky not to equalise as Gosford's tough schedule began to tell.
- Next round will see two Saturday night matches, one of which is between Gosford City and Terrigal at Pluim Park. SEU travel to Erina High to meet Avoca on Sunday.

TERRIGAL vs KILLARNEY DISTRICT

- Killarney District's excellent early-season form has continued with a big 7-3 win over Terrigal at another renovated field, this time at Duffys Oval. The Terriers are yet to lose in their nine matches so far this season in three competitions including the Central Coast Cup final. They went into this match after a tough FFA Cup match on Thursday night but with the confidence of a big win over Terrigal in the early rounds of the CC Cup. Killarney had the game well in hand at the half-time break with a 3-1 lead, which they took to 5-1 early in the second period. Terrigal fought back to 5-3 before the visitors finished the scoring with two late goals. Importantly for Killarney all six goals (one was an own goal) came from different players – brothers Matt and Brendan Hall, Todd Leach, Cameron Pryse-Jones and John Whelpdale. Anthony Pace (2) and Connor Wilkinson scored for Terrigal.
- Things won't get any easier for Terrigal next week when they take on Gosford City at Plum Park on Saturday night. Killarney District will be looking to extend their unbeaten run against Wyoming at EDSACC North on Sunday.

WYOMING vs THE ENTRANCE

- Wyoming has picked up a confidence-boosting point with a 3-3 draw against defending premiers The Entrance at Alan Davidson Park. The Tigers took an early lead through Sam Dooley which was cancelled out from the penalty spot by Nathan Blunden in the 35th minute. The Sea Eagles were reduced to 10 men early in the second half with Tyson Adams red-carded with Wyoming grabbing the lead just two minutes later with an excellent goal from midfielder Mark Bellemore. The twin setbacks sparked the premiers into action and two goals in 15 minutes from Ben Runge gave them a 3-2 lead. With five minutes to play defender Andrew Watts equalised for Wyoming setting up a frantic last few minutes with the Tigers narrowly missing out on a late winner.
- Both teams will have tough encounters next week with The Entrance home in a local derby against Berkeley Vale at Pat Morley Oval on Saturday night in the club's annual Travis Bragg Memorial match. Wyoming will play just down the road against Killarney at EDSACC on Sunday.



UMINA vs BERKELEY VALE

- Another match where both teams were backing up from midweek FFA Cup matches. Having opted out of the Central Coast Cup Berkeley Vale were something of an unknown quantity but have now shown that they will yet again be serious title contenders with an impressive 3-0 away win over Umina. Troy Mumford opened the scoring from the penalty spot in the 8th minute with Liam Naughton doubling the lead late in the first half. Striker John Dineen-Griffin then settled the result with his first goal of the season in the 75th minute.
- Umina have their third straight home game next Sunday against the emerging Toukley outfit while Berkeley Vale take on The Entrance at Pat Morley on Saturday night.

TOUKLEY vs AVOCA

- Toukley have come into the 2016 Premier League with plenty of confidence from an experienced squad and, with a 1-0 win over Avoca, now sit at the head of the table on goal difference. The match was played at Harry Moore Oval with the field needing to be mowed by club members early on Sunday morning to meet Premier League standards after Wyong Council failed to cut it during the week. The only goal in what was an even, exciting match came in the 27th minute with Dean Pepper threading a through ball for Jai Kelly to add to his first round hat-trick and share the early lead in the Golden Boot ranking.
- Toukley make the long trek down to Umina Oval next Sunday while Avoca will be at home against Southern-Ettalong, also on Sunday.
