SUMMARY

- The deferred Round 10 matches in the Battlewin Premier League have been played over the scheduled 'spare' weekend and, although the scores differed, the results of all five matches were the same as in the corresponding matches in the opening round of the competition back in April. The top three teams all won with Gosford City ominously strong in defeating The Entrance in their re-match of last season's grand final.
- The battle to avoid relegation also heated up with the bottom four teams meeting each other and Avoca and Umina each recording crucial wins.

GOSFORD CITY vs THE ENTRANCE

- A stunning first half onslaught has seen Gosford City outclass defending premiers The Entrance 7-1 in the inaugural Coast Shelter Cup charity match played at Pluim Park on Saturday night. With the field shrouded in mist the Dragons led 2-0 after just five minutes with the opening goal to Adam Woodbine (the first in a hat-trick for the 2015 CCFC first grade captain) followed quickly by a penalty conversion by Matt Hall. Woodbine's second goal in the 14th minute was followed by a brace to Josh Schumann in the 29th and 32nd minutes. Dean Caletti then finished the half with his first goal for the club. The second half was much more even with Woodbine on target again before Ryan Wilson scored a consolation goal for The Entrance.
- Gosford City will now take on the struggling Berkeley Vale team twice at Mingara in the next ten days, next Sunday and then again on Wednesday week in their deferred Round 5 match. It doesn't get any easier for The Entrance – they meet unbeaten leaders Killarney District at EDSACC North next Sunday.

WYOMING vs UMINA

- In the first of two crucial relegation encounters on the weekend Umina have picked up just their second win of the season, defeating Wyoming 3-2 in the other Saturday night match at Pluim Park. Umina dominated for much of the match with only some outstanding saves by Tigers goalkeeper and captain Ben Xerri keeping his team in contact. Ben Scully-Hawkins gave Umina the lead after just two minutes with Wyoming equalising through Keelan Austen in the 38th minute. Umina then opened the second half with an early goal, this time through striker Gareth Slater followed by a second to Scully-Hawkins midway through the half.

Wyoming did strike back quickly with Austen's second goal but couldn't avoid conceding the vital three points to Umina.

- The result sees Umina leap-frog Wyoming into ninth place two points ahead of Wyoming although the Tigers do have a game in hand. Umina will be at home next Sunday against Terrigal as will Wyoming when they will put their season and survival on the line in the first of two back-to-back matches against Avoca.



TERRIGAL vs TOUKLEY

- As they did in the opening round of the season Toukley have recorded a big win over fellow-promoted club Terrigal, scoring six unanswered goals after being 2-nil midway through the first half for a 6-2 win at Plum Park. Despite missing six regular first-graders Terrigal controlled the match early with Alex Arbello scoring twice before Will Haines (the first of two goals) and Damien Lobb leveled the score at half-time. Terrigal had no answer to the pace of the Gunners attack in the second period with Jai Kelly recording his third hat-trick of the season and moving within one goal of the previous tearaway leader, Killarney's Tim Knight, in the race for the 2016 Battlewin Golden Boot trophy.
- After an inconsistent month that saw them drop eight points in four matches Toukley look back to the form that saw them string together six straight wins at the start of the season. They remain comfortably in second place six points behind Killarney and five ahead of Gosford City but will need to be on guard when they return to Harry Moore Oval for next Sunday's match against Southern-Ettalong, well aware that Gosford could be breathing down their neck if they win their two matches against Berkeley Vale.
- After surging up the table Terrigal have now been beaten twice in two matches and, although still in fourth place will need to return to winning form when they meet Umina next Sunday at Umina Oval.

SOUTHERN-ETTALONG vs KILLARNEY DISTRICT

- Killarney District have extended their unbeaten run to 12 matches with a 3-1 win over Southern & Ettalong United at James Browne Oval. The Terriers made a flying start with Todd Leach scoring inside the first minute of the match. They then had to wait nearly an hour before Tim Knight doubled the lead with a second to Leach midway through the second half effectively sealing the win, although SEU did score virtually from the restart of play through James Caban.
- Southern will travel north to take on the difficult task of defeating Toukley at Harry Moore Oval while Killarney will be back at EDSACC for what looms as a typically tough local derby against an Entrance team that will be looking to bounce back from their big loss to Gosford City.

AVOCA vs BERKELEY VALE

- In the second relegation battle of the weekend Avoca has picked up three vital points with a 3-1 win over Berkeley Vale at Mingara Sports Oval. Avoca have been struggling to score in recent matches and it took a pair of penalties by Nathan Watt in the 35th and 55th minutes, split by a goal to Louis Kellerman just before the break to give the Sharks control of the match. Berkeley Vale did hit back with a first Premier League first grade goal to Brodie Knowles in the 65th minute.
- The win moves Avoca four points clear of the relegation zone with back-to-back matches against Wyoming in the next 10 days likely to play a major role in their battle to remain in Premier League next season. The same applies to Berkeley Vale although they will face much tougher opposition in their two matches against Gosford City.
